

Alta-Aurelia CSD Medication at School

It is the policy of the Alta-Aurelia Community School District to require parents/guardians permission before medication is given to students during the school day.

When possible, we ask that parents/guardians make every attempt to give their children medication at home. As an example, medication to be given 3 times a day can be given at home before school, after school and before bedtime. However we understand that there are times when medication must be administered at school because of Dr's orders.

Please follow these steps for medication to be given at school:

1. Send the medication in the ORIGINAL container from the pharmacy, asking for a separate bottle for school. The label must include: student's name, name of medication, dosage, time to be given, route to be given and Dr's name.
2. Please sign and return the bottom of this form along with any special instructions.
3. Over the counter medication may be given, provided they are in the original container.
4. The Alta-Aurelia School District has generic children's liquid "Tylenol", generic adult strength "Tylenol" 325mg and Ibuprofen 200mg tabs available. We cannot treat fevers at school.
